The Little River City Council met in regular session Monday, January 11, at 7 pm in City Hall. Mayor Donnie Teeters called the meeting to order. Council members present were Doug Eller, Lucas Raleigh, Randy Burdick, and John Tietjens. Danny Stephenson was unable to attend.

The minutes of the previous session were approved as read.

Condemnation hearing on 430 Harrison street was held. Owners have made repairs on the house and the council will have it re-inspected.

There were no public comments.

Departments:

Maintenance: Lucas Baumbach and Jared Jones were present. Jared will attend a water conference in Wichita in March. The new skid steer is being used on city streets. A geologists checked chloride levels in well 13 and reported they are lower than they had been. The backhoe has been repaired.

Law Enforcement: BJ Smith was present. He turned in a written report and also said the burglary investigation for Garden of Eden is still ongoing.

City Clerk: Sue Peters was present. The monthly sales tax from the city was \$3377.73 and county was \$3248.51. A safety inspection was completed and was good. Lucas Raleigh will take care of advertising and an article in the Lyons News supplement, Plains and Progress.

Unfinished Business: Sewer mains and property acquisitions update were tabled.

Property at 550 Eagle Street which was heavily damaged in a fire was inspected and is set for demolition.

New Business:

The council voted to donate \$50 to the Shrine Circus and \$50 to the Learning Center for the Donkey Basketball fundraiser.

Camera for Main Street were tabled

The Lions Club has volunteered to help in removal of trees on Main Street. The city will check into getting branches out of power lines first.

The council voted to pay the bills as presented.
